COMPUTER ALERT PROTECT YOUR INVESTMENT – PROTECT YOUR PRODUCT KEY

Your computer cannot run without an operating system (OS). A large part of your initial computer investment, although usually included in the

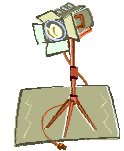
price, is the OS. Windows XP is probably the most used operating system right now but there are many users with Windows 98 and the new OS, Windows Vista. This article hopes to alert you to several facts that will ultimately help you protect your computer investment.

When you purchase an operating system via CD or DVD you are given a product key. Not many of us purchase the OS this way, however. We buy the computer and are given the OS, and the product key is usually affixed

SPOTLIGHT ON FREE STUFF - EBOOKS



If you are an avid reader or just want to find a book on a subject of interest, eBooks may be the answer for you. An eBook is the electronic equivalent of a printed book. The books can be read using a free reader program on your computer. You can purchase eBooks but many of them are also available free over the Internet. Following is a brief description of just one of the many websites that gives you access to free eBooks.

THE UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA LIBRARY'S ETEXT CENTER is one site which provides eBooks free of charge. The eBook web address is <http://etext.lib.virginia.edu/ebooks/>. The site claims it has, "Over 2,100 publicly-available eBooks . . . including classic British and American fiction, major authors, children's literature, American history, Shakespeare, African-American documents, the Bible, and much more. "

The site also provides a link so you can download *Microsoft Reader*, Microsoft Corporation's free eBook reader. The reader allows you to download and keep eBooks on your computer for ease of use.

What we have been seeing at PC Tutor with alarming rate is that the product key is either removed from the computer or it is fading and can be barely read, if at all. It also seems that the newer computers are being made with very flimsy product key stickers. I have seen several on the brink of fading. Recently, a laptop had a sticker that was so badly worn that one of the numbers was completely faded. This machine was barely one-year old. We needed the key to reinstall the OS. Lucky for the client only one number was missing. We were able to guess the errant digit on the 3rd try (there were 36 possibilities) and proceeded to complete the job.

A missing or badly faded product key sticker can become a big problem for the client without a record of it. The computer technician can do nothing with such a machine unless it is found. An OS that malfunctions because of a virus or other problem will need the product key to recover. Without that key the owner will likely have to repurchase the OS, a very expensive alternative.

In order to protect your investment be sure you protect your product key. The best way to do this is to leave the sticker attached to the computer case and cover it with a heavy grade of clear tape. As an extra precaution, write the product key down and put it with your important papers. Spending time protecting your product key now could save you big headaches and money later.

YOU TUBE

One of my favorite websites is You Tube, but not for the reason that most people use it. I like You Tube because I can learn all sorts of things from it. I am a hands-on, do it yourself kind of person which makes You Tube perfect for me. Anytime I want know how to do something I search its video library to see if there is a how-to video. Virus Corner – Setting Up a Restore Point May Save Your System

Advice for Windows Operating System Users Win 98 and later

Have you had that sinking feeling when you know you just picked up a virus from the Internet? Things slow down, you are bombarded with pop-up warnings and you know you've been hit. Not a good situation, but you may be able to recover, if you're lucky and you act quickly.

The path to recovery is the System Restore point. According to Microsoft, System Restore "...helps you restore your computer's system files to an earlier point in time. It's a way to undo system changes to your computer without affecting your personal files, such as e-mail, documents, or photos."

Now you may be saying to yourself, "I've never used system restore." If you haven't, and you're in a bind, you still may be able to use it. That's because periodically when changes are made to your system, restore points are automatically created. There may be several available to you even if you have never set one yourself. Click the START button, ACCESSORIES, SYSTEM TOOLS to access system restore. Follow the prompts to restore your computer "to an earlier time." That time should be a date before you started

But wait! Luck has a lot to do with your success. You see, some viruses are so insidious they will prevent you from accessing the restore point. They will change your system registry so you cannot access it. This is likely to happen if you didn't act quickly once the virus was discovered.
